Distinctive Features: A very poor, traditional country now facing new policy possibilities after economic take-off. Low but now increasing female labor force participation. Social expenditures heavily means-tested.

Maternity / Parental Leave

Benefit	Maternity: cash benefit and job-protected leave; Parental: job-protected leave
Eligibility Criteria	Maternity: universal for working women who satisfy social security contribution requirement; Parental: universal for any parent.
Duration of Leave	Maternity: 18 weeks (4 wks before baby is due; Parental: 14 wks at any time until child is 5
Compensation Rate	Maternity: 70% wage replacement (with guaranteed minimum and maximum) Parental: unpaid

Early Childhood Education and Care

Age Group Served	0 – 5
Eligibility Criteria	Working parents; dependent on supply
Fees	Income-related parent fees
Locus of Care	Centers, preschools, family day care homes
Funding Strategies	Govt., parent fees
Access/Coverage (%)	Ages 0 – 3 (2%); age 4 (54%), age 5 (99%); age 3-6 (55%)

Family and Child Allowances

Benefit & Eligibility	Universal cash benefit for all residents with one or more children until age 19, if in school or disabled; otherwise to 16.
Benefit Level	Flat rate; vary with ordinal position of child. Means-tested supplement for lone-parent families (low).

Child and Family Tax Benefits

Tax Deductions/Relief	Tax concessions for widows/widowers caring for a disabled child, and lone parents

Other Child-Conditioned Income Transfers

Benefits	Survivor's benefits; dependent-child supplements to old-age benefits and unemployment insurance; means-tested orphan's pension. Family income supplement for low-pay families with children.

Access to Coverage	Population entitled to free (low income) or subsidized health care; universal care for infants and for school-aged children through free school health service.
